

Resolution of the Town of Brooklyn, Green County

To Allow for Electronic/Virtual Meeting Attendance

Resolution # 7-27-20

WHEREAS, the Town of Brooklyn Board of Supervisors, or any committees of the Town Board, may wish to either occasionally or routinely conduct meetings in such a manner that allows some members of that body and members of the public to attend and participate without being physically present at the meeting place identified on the meeting agenda (also known as virtual attendance); and

WHEREAS, the Office of the Wisconsin Attorney General did, on March 20, 2020, release an advisory concerning compliance with open meeting laws when conducting meetings, enabling attendance from remote locations during the duration of the COVID-19 pandemic; and


WHEREAS, the Town of Brooklyn Board of Supervisors is committed to both full compliance with applicable open meeting laws while also enabling board members and the public to participate in meetings whether physically present or virtually present.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Town of Brooklyn hereby allows when conducting Town Board meetings or Town Committee meetings members of the town board, town board committees and the public to attend meetings from remote locations by use of the videoconferencing and/or teleconferencing.


