Sharon George's donation enabled the Attica Cemetery Association to purchase a new marker for the Schmidt family. The front of the marker features Johann Schmidt and his family. His mother-in-law Wilhelmine Krueger is on the back. Five members of the family are buried in the cemetery. Auguste died January 23, 1919 and Johann died just five days later on January 28, 1919 from the flu; they left behind several children. A difficult family to research, Johann is in records as John, Bernard, Bernhardt, and Frederick, with surnames of Schmidt, Smidth, and Smith. One of the two infants is Edwin or Irving (depending upon which record you believe); he died at the age of two years. The other infant/child is possibly Etta or Elsie (again depending upon which record you believe). According to family, Erwin and Elsie died before 1914. Erwin has a death record listed as Irving, so 1901 is probably the year of his death. Elsie does not show up in the 1910 census so she probably had passed sometime prior.

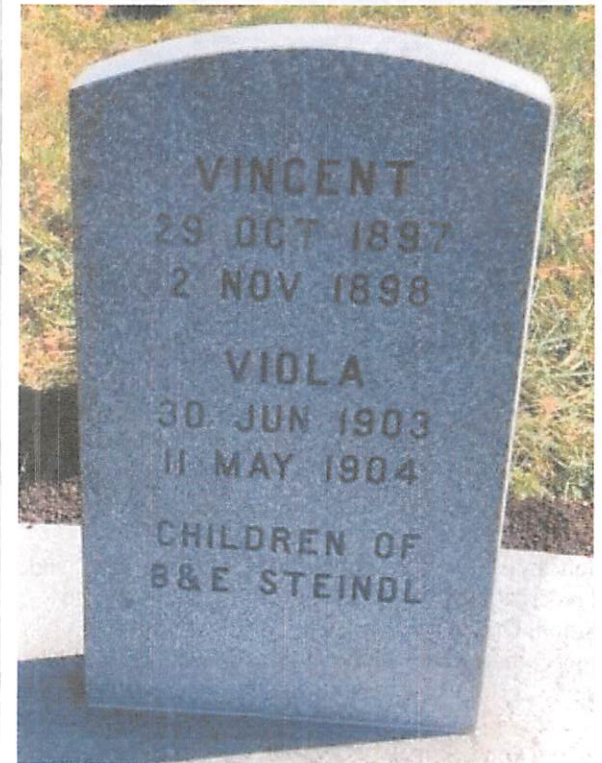
Finances & Brooklyn Township
